Presbytery Consultation Report -

Following the Congregational Workshop conducted by our Presbytery representatives Chris Barnett and Nancy Cox on July 20, a draft interim report was presented to Council this week. This process has been known previously as a 'Mission Study'; in our case the workshop and report builds on the Memorandum of Understanding/Covenant agreed to by the Congregation in October 2024 which resulted in our official amalgamation in April this year. Please note this report is from Chris and Nancy to the Presbytery Pastoral Relations Committee (PRC). It is written about us, it is not written to us.

The report is one of the steps on our journey toward calling a Ministry Agent/Minister. The next steps include

- Minor revisions based on the discussion with Church Council this past week
- Presentation of the report to the PRC in early September
- If accepted by PRC, we will be given permission to form a Joint Nominating Committee (JNC) whose task it will be to define our needs for a minister and work through the process of calling a minister.

The report has highlighted some issues which Council would like to explore further with the congregation. These include: Re-focusing on Agreed Priorities, Connecting our Longed-for Future with Present Reality, Planning for Financial Sustainability, Understanding what is causing anxiety, and Leadership Support. *Please help us with this.* We will be asking you, formally and informally, to help us understand what is behind the comments raised in the workshop and what you would like to see the Council, in leading the congregation, doing to address the issues.

Thank you in advance for your honesty and commitment to our future. In Christ.
