From Rev Barb Strickland to the Modern-Day Followers of Jesus in Ashburton-Burwood Uniting Church:

Written at the beginning of Spring 2025, a time of new growth and promise of new life

Over the next four weeks, a key focus in our worship will be on how God guides and sustains us through times of challenge and change. You are at a pivotal point in your faith journey as a congregation of people from Ashburton and Burwood. I so want to encourage you all at this time. Times of transition require a lot of resilience of spirit and the resolve to keep moving forward in spite of difficulties. However, I applaud you for what I have observed amongst you - a willingness to be faithful to God's leading even when it is uncomfortable and an openness to meeting and sharing with active goodwill with people whom you do not yet know well as you walk this journey of faith together. Well done! Know that you are not alone. The Holy Spirit accompanies you and is amongst you as you gather, as you plan, as you lead, as you explore and as you dream. **"Do not lose heart"**. Paul shared these words when speaking to the Corinthians in 2 Corinthians, Chapter 4. We all have treasure in jars of clay, but God is working on our clay (*thanks be to God!*) so that God's immense treasure can be seen and shown to everyone. Being moulded can be painful! We may experience much bruising and discomfort, but the Potter has in mind a wonderful new shape for us. We are all weak, but we are being transformed, each of us and together, into the disciples and into the community that God desires.
